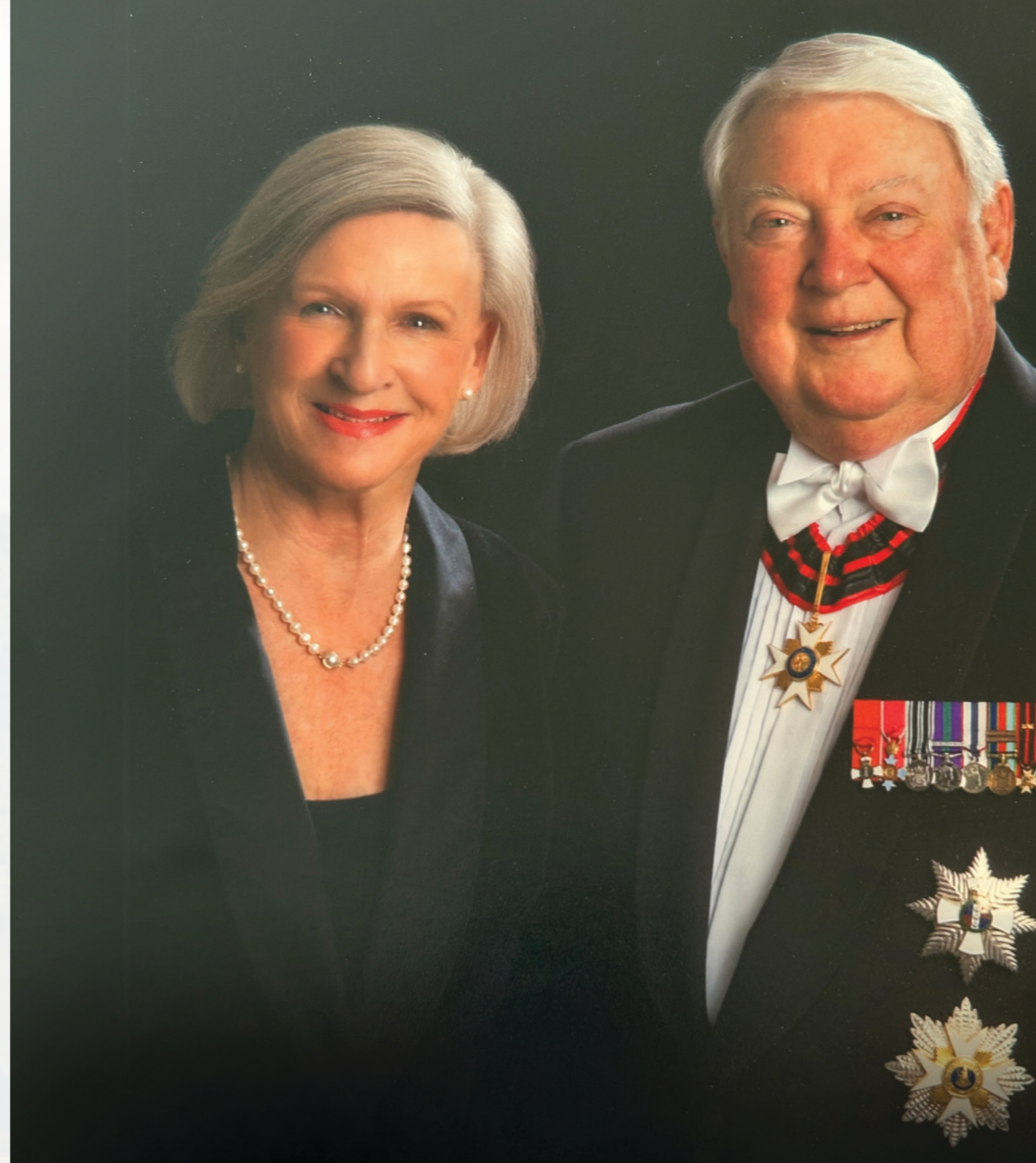

A Reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians (4:13-18):

We want you to be quite certain, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, to make sure you do not grieve about them like people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again; and that it is the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them to Him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the Archangel will call out the command and the Lord Himself will come down from heaven. Those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those who are still alive will be taken up into the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord.
